Here is a break down of the different ways to contact Police.

999 - In an emergency always dial 999, for example for an incident that is happening at that precise time,

101 - For anything that does not require immediate Police assistance. You can also report any issues via the Metropolitan Police web site, such as crime reports, accidents and Anti-social behaviour.

SNT Mobile - This is our contact number which will also be shown on our website, please contact our team through the above number for general Anti Social Behaviour calls and neighbour disputes that will require SNT intervention. We do work shifts so calls may be diverted to a central number but you will be contacted back as soon as team are back on duty. The Number is - **07920233892**

Ward Promises

At our most recent Ward Panel Meeting in May 2017 the panel and Police agreed to the following ward promises.

ASB on the ward - Regular patrols in and around the town centre area to be conducted on every shift and any reports of anti social behaviour to be dealt with by the team. The team will work closely with Croydon Council to combat ongoing issues.

Patrol high priority burglary hotspots- To patrol areas where burglaries have occurred and complete Crime prevention visits to every victim. Plain clothes tactics to also be implemented.

Theft of / from Motor Vehicles- To reduce motor vehicle crime of all kinds across the ward, focusing on theft from motor vehicle. Completing patrols across the ward and undertake intelligence led patrols in hotspot areas when they are identified.

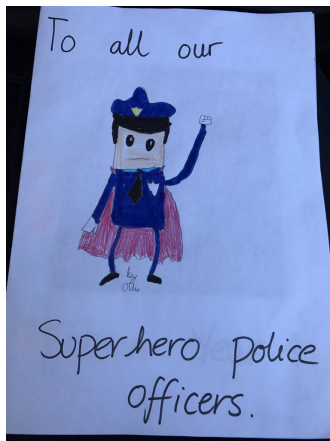


Good News Stories

Crime Figures

March 2017

In March 2017 there were ten burglaries on the Purley ward, four of these were committed on non-residential premises and six were in residential properties. In March 2016 there were twelve burglaries which all took place in residential properties. There has been a reduction in burglaries this year compared to last.

There were six theft from motor vehicles and four theft of motor vehicles this year in March. Compared to March 2016 the statistics are very similar for these offences.

A robbery took place where a group of males approached the victim outside the Purley Leisure Centre and demanded he hand over his belongings. The victim handed his property to the suspect and left the scene.

April 2017

In April 2017 there were eleven burglaries in Purley, two of these took place in non-residential premises and two were attempted burglaries. In April 2016 there were 6 burglaries in total, one of which was an attempted burglary. Unfortunately the number of Burglaries this April have risen slightly compared to last year.

There were two theft from motor vehicles and three theft of motor vehicles. When compared to last year where there were eight theft from motor vehicles and three theft of motor vehicles this type of crime has significantly reduced this April compared to April 2017.
