NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Neighbourhood Watch is about people getting together with their neighbours to take action to reduce crime.

PRIORITIES

Motor Vehicle Crime

In September, 5 Theft from Motor Vehicles and 5 Theft of Motor Vehicles took place.

Over last couple of months we have seen a number vehicles accessed due to the fact the vehicle was unlocked. Fuelling up or popping back into your house to get something are perfect examples of how easy it is to turn your back for a moment and forget your vehicle is unsecured. So get into the habit of locking your vehicle even if you're only going to be away from it for a moment.

If your vehicle has wing mirrors that fold in automatically when locked, make sure you lock it properly. Criminal gangs are looking for vehicles like these where the wing mirrors are still out because it is clear to them that the vehicle has been left unlocked.

Your mobile phone, coins for the car park, sunglasses, packs of medication or other items that can earn quick cash are irresistible to the opportunist thief. Remember, the cost of replacing a window is often much more than that of what's stolen. It should go without saying that wallets, handbags, purses and credit cards should never be left in an unattended vehicle.

Burglary

In September, 1 Residential and 2 Business & Community Burglaries took place.

Many people don't secure their shed or garage in the same way they do their homes - often using an easy-tobreak lock or padlock to protect valuable contents such as a car, bike or lawnmower. An opportunistic burglar will try a shed or garage first because they can find the tools they need to break into the main house.

Burglary is not a victimless crime. It's traumatic to lose valuable and personally important items from your home - and the emotional shock of having your property invaded can also be deeply upsetting. Even if nothing has been stolen, the thought of a stranger being in your home can be very distressing and feel like a violation of your security. Some people blame themselves if they forgot to secure a window or door, or if they were tricked by the burglar, but it's important to remember it's not your fault . It's important to feel safe in your own home. Homes with no security measures are five times more likely to be burgled than those with simple security measures in place.


