Responding to your concerns



You said: Burglary is a concern for the residents of Sanderstead.

We did: We have continued to conduct a mixture of high visibility and plain clothes patrols around residential roads. We have visited victims of burglaries and informed neighbours so they are aware what has happened and to review their home security. We have discussed crime prevention measures with all householders we have spoken with.

You said: We need to reduce vehicle crime in Sanderstead.

We did: We've combined high visibility and plain clothes patrols used for burglary prevention with the motor vehicle crime prevention patrols. We've conducted leaflet drops in hot spot areas to keep residents alerted to the issues and remind them to remain vigilant.

You said: You'd like us to tackle anti-social behaviour within the parks and open spaces.

We did: We have listened to local concerns around anti-social behaviour (ASB) in the parks and open spaces on the ward, specifically Weytern Tree Gardens/Purley Beeches, Sanderstead Recreation Ground and Kings Wood/Hamsey Green area. We have patrolled the different areas at random times around the day as well as more targeted times in response to specific information received. As a result we have dealt with 9 people for drugs.

Drop in Surgery

We will be running 'Drop in Surgeries', which is a one on one consultation session with members of the team throughout the ward. These meetings will be running periodically. See website for details.

Officers from your local team maintain a close working relationship with staff at Riddlesdown Collegiate. As one of the largest secondary schools in Croydon, we believe in working with staff and students to help develop a better understanding of police work and their own personal responsibilities within the community. A member of school staff also regularly attends ward panel meetings to discuss the school with other members of the ward panel and police.

Latest Borough News

Anti-Social Behaviour

Croydon Safer Neighbourhood Teams will be working in partnership with the Local Authority responding to issues of anti-social behaviour (ASB) identified in a survey circulated to 6000 Croydon households. Results are being used to plan bespoke ward activity to tackle issues such as fly tipping, street drinking and ASB attached to licensed premises. Further surveys are planned to monitor its effectiveness. If you want to get involved, please contact your team.

New police team

The borough has resourced a new community policing team called the Community Tasking Team to enhance police visibility. This will provide a deterrent to individuals intent on engaging in anti-social behaviour and criminality. The team of 20 officers is tasked with patrolling specific areas based on intelligence gained from the local community. They are using powers under anti-social behaviour legislation to disperse those engaged in ASB from designated areas for periods up to 48hrs.
