

Urgent notice: STOLEN PACKAGES

SNT are currently urging our residents to be more vigilant and on the lookout for parcel thefts which have been reported to us as being on the rise this festive season.

This has been reported recently "THE RIDGE WAY" but we usually see an increase in opportunistic thefts around this time of the year

Active community links:

Sanderstead officers have taken an active role in joining in together with our residents as well as those on neighbouring wards in the celebration and secure ushering in of the festive period ahead. Some of these included Atwood primary fireworks and the Selsdon Christmas lights switch on.

Area of interest:

Our team has taken a particular interest and also put forward proactive steps in trying to tackle the issue of theft of vehicles on our ward of Sanderstead.

This was a key point discussed at our ward panel which we have followed up with a visit to **Range Rover** and spoken to a service manager who offered useful tips on safeguarding of vehicles. Some the tips shared were the use of **Ghost trackers** which come handy as they are a self-set device with the owner's passcode and also hard to detect by criminals once placed in vehicles.

Disklok Steering wheel locks were also put forward as being a very effective measure in potentially deterring of car theft criminals as these completely lock and jam the steering which makes it hard for criminals to undo when trying to make off with the vehicle.
