Here is a break down of the different ways to contact Police.

999 - In an emergency always dial 999, for example for an incident that is happening at that precise time,

101 - For anything that does not require immediate Police assistance. You can also report any issues via the Metropolitan Police web site, such as crime reports, accidents and anti-social behaviour.

SNT Mobile - This is our contact number which will also be shown on our website, please contact our team through the above number for general Anti Social Behaviour calls and neighbour disputes that will require SNT intervention. We do work shifts so calls may be diverted to a central number but you will be contacted back as soon as team are back on duty. The Number is - **07920233892**

Ward Priorities

At our most recent Ward Panel Meeting in December 2017 the panel and Police agreed to the following ward promises.

ASB on the ward - Regular patrols in and around the town centre area to be conducted on every shift and any reports of anti social behaviour to be dealt with by the team. The team will work closely with Croydon Council to combat ongoing issues.

Patrol high priority burglary hotspots- To patrol areas where burglaries have occurred and complete crime prevention visits to every victim. Plain clothes tactics to also be implemented.

Theft of / from Motor Vehicles- To reduce motor vehicle crime of all kinds across the ward, focusing on theft from motor vehicle. Completing patrols across the ward and undertake intelligence led patrols in hotspot areas when they are identified.

A Male who was arrested at a Purley warrant on 19th June 2017 was convicted in Central London Magistrates Court of Kidnap, False Imprisonment and possession with intent to supply class B drugs. He has also pled to three other counts of possession with intent to supply drugs and will be sentenced on 23rd February 2018. We would like to say thank you to the Kidnap Unit.



The Purley team attended The Gingerbread House nursery to introduce ourselves to the children. They asked us questions and tried on bits of the uniform, a couple of the children even had their own Police outfits on.

Purley Officers along with Broad Green Officers executed a warrant at two venues after receiving intelligence regarding suspected modern slavery offences. No offences were identified and no arrests were made but we take allegations of modern slavery very seriously and will always act on information given to us.

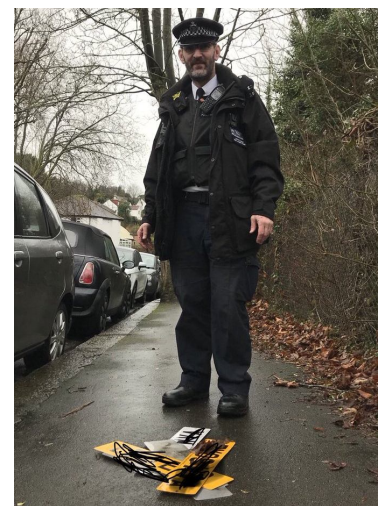

Crime Figures

December 2017

There were thirteen burglaries in December. Six were in residential premises, four in business premises and three were attempted burglaries. In December 2016 there were eleven burglaries in total. Seven took place in Residential property, three in business premises and one was attempted.

There were eight theft from motor vehicles and four theft of motor vehicles compared to December 2016 where there were five theft from motor vehicles and four theft of motor vehicles.

These crimes have risen this year compared to last. Please keep doors, windows and gates locked to help deter these thieves.

January 2018

There were fourteen burglaries in January this year. Eleven occurred in residential properties, two were attempted and one was an aggravated burglary. In January 2017 there were seven burglaries. Four were in residential properties, one was an attempted burglary and two occurred on business premises.

There have been four theft of Motor vehicles and fourteen theft from motor vehicles this January but there were no theft of motor vehicles and seven theft from motor vehicles in January 2017.
