Here is a break down of the different ways to contact Police.

999 - In an emergency always dial 999, for example for an incident that is happening at that precise time,

101 - For anything that does not require immediate Police assistance. You can also report any issues via the Metropolitan Police web site, such as crime reports, accidents and Anti-social behaviour.

SNT Mobile - This is our contact number which will also be shown on our website, please contact our team through the above number for general Anti Social Behaviour calls and neighbour disputes that will require SNT intervention. We do work shifts so calls may be diverted to a central number but you will be contacted back as soon as team are back on duty. The Number is - **07920233892**

Ward Priorities

At our most recent Ward Panel Meeting in September 2017 the panel and Police agreed to the following ward promises.

ASB on the ward - Regular patrols in and around the town centre area to be conducted on every shift and any reports of anti social behaviour to be dealt with by the team. The team will work closely with Croydon Council to combat ongoing issues.

Patrol high priority burglary hotspots- To patrol areas where burglaries have occurred and complete Crime prevention visits to every victim. Plain clothes tactics to also be implemented.

Theft of / from Motor Vehicles- To reduce motor vehicle crime of all kinds across the ward, focusing on theft from motor vehicle. Completing patrols across the ward and undertake intelligence led patrols in hotspot areas when they are identified.

Crime Figures

October 2017

In October 2017 there were eleven burglaries in total. Eight took place in residential properties and three happened in commercial premises. In October 2016 there were nine burglaries. Four happened in residential premises, four took place in commercial properties and there was one attempted burglary.

There have been ten theft from motor vehicles and zero theft of motor vehicles this month compared to last year where there were five theft from motor vehicles and one theft of a motor vehicle.

These crimes have risen slightly this year compared to last.

November 2017

During November 2017 there have unfortunately been seventeen burglaries. Twelve took place in residential premises, three in commercial premises and two were attempted. There were twelve burglaries in November of last year. This is still high but due to Christmas coming up burglaries tend to rise at this time of year. The majority of entry is through insecure gates and breaking vulnerable windows at the rear of properties.

There have been eight theft from motor vehicles and three theft of motor vehicles. In 2016 there were six theft from motor vehicles and one theft of a motor vehicle.

These crimes have risen this year compared to last. Please keep doors, windows and gates locked to help deter these thieves.
